PROFESSIONAL LEARNING DEVELOPMENT





POIPOIA TE PITOMATA Universal Design for Learning

This workshop aimed to deepen kaiako understanding of neurodevelopment and trauma-informed, inclusive practice through a mātauranga Māori Iens.

Participants explored Te Whare o Oro, neurodiversity, and frameworks like Te Tūāpapa o He Pikorua and Universal Design for Learning.

KIA WANA TE AKO Reo ā-Waha | Reo ā-Tā

Over two days, kaiako came equipped to strengthen their teaching of reo ā-waha and reo ā-tā. While day 1 focussed on reo-ā-waha, day 2 was an opportunity for kaiako to explore reo ā-tā strategies suited to ākonga who are reading and writing independently. The wānanga provided practical tools, rich kōrero, and a space for kaiako to share, reflect, and grow.



KA MAREWA Leadership Bootcamp

It was a full house at Ka Marewa, held in Wellington in May. Participants had the opportunity to explore their unique leadership style and how it influences others, while learning strategies to build confidence and thrive in their leadership role. 


NEW MĀTAURANGA MĀORI RESOURCES
