Restorative Conferences

- Essential for creating a positive learning culture in the classroom.
- Encourages students to accept responsibility for their actions, and to repair and heal relationships.
- Fosters a sense of community in the classroom.
- Built on values that separate the person from the behaviour.
 - Can you explain wha happened?
 - How were you feeling of the time?
 - 3 What were you thinking
 - How do you think this made others feel?
 - 5 Who was affected?
 - 6 Why do you think that?
 - What could we do to make things right again?
 - How could you do things differently if this occured again?
