EXTERNAL

By the end of level 8 students can:

- understand much of what is written in te reo Māori about a range of topics across a range of written text types intended for different purposes and audiences
- distinguish between facts and opinions and recognise intentions to persuade and influence
- use resources such as dictionaries and glossaries to experiment with new language and to review writing for accuracy
- write in te reo Māori about a range of topics, using words and expressions that are appropriate for the purpose and intended audience
- begin to use language to entertain and persuade as well as to inform.

Ngā Whāinga Paetae - Achievement Objectives

Level 8 students should be able to:

- 8.1 communicate about certainty and uncertainty, possibility and probability
- 8.2 develop an argument or point of view, with reasons
- 8.3 recount a series of events to inform, persuade, or entertain
- 8.4 communicate the same information in different ways for different audiences
- 8.5 respond to selected and adapted texts in te reo Māori that are about te reo and tikanga Māori (for example, texts from recorded speeches, literature, film, newspapers, magazines, television, video, DVD, and radio).



INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE KAIAKO

The student is required to produce a piece of writing on ONE topic in **te reo Māori only.** In previous external examinations the student is provided with a selection of topics and selects one topic only to complete the assessment task.

Note these **guidelines** for students to produce a piece of writing for high achievement of the standard:

- Be relevant to all aspects of the topic and related text type.
- Be written in correct te reo Māori include accurate spelling and grammar.
- Include a wide range of vocabulary and language structures.
- Be well set out in a logical way that shows a coherent flow of ideas.
- Be interesting and/or informative to the reader.
- Contain original thoughts, ideas, and opinions as intended.

This practice examination resource provides a selection of possible topics that you may use over time for students to practice and as an integrated part of your reo Māori teaching and learning programme.

When selecting different topics and re-setting practice examinations, you are advised to carefully critique any changes to the modified student assessment material to ensure that the work is consistent with the national standard.

You are encouraged to work with colleagues and your professional associations to add to this selection of writing topics so that students have many opportunities to practice across a range of topics, writing contexts and writing genre.

CONTEXT

This is a practice examination for the national standard *Tuhi i te reo Māori o te ao whānui,* Te Reo Māori, Kaupae Tuatoru.

The achievement objective of this practice examination is to assess your skills and knowledge to write in te reo Māori about a chosen topic, within a specified text type and for an intended purposes and audience.

Completion of one writing task enables you to achieve either the paetae, kaiaka or kairangi grade of this standard.

- is relevant to the topic, and addresses all aspects of the task
- is written in correct te reo Māori

KAUPAPA TUHITUHI

Tuhia he tuhinga ōkawa, he tuhinga tātaritanga ōkawa rānei ki te reo Māori, kia 350 kupu te roa mō **TĒTAHI** o ngā kaupapa kua āta whakaritea i raro iho nei.

I te tuatahi, me āta kohikohi ō whakaaro, me whakatakoto hoki i tētahi mahere whakaaro hei āwhina koe ki te whakatutuki i ngā āhua ake o te kaupapa kua kōwhirihia e koe.

Whāia ngā tikanga o te tuhinga roa, o te whare kōrero o te Māori rānei.

WRITING THEMES

Write a formal essay or a formal critical analysis in te reo Māori, 350 words in length, on **ONE** of the topics that have been carefully presented below.

Firstly, gather your thoughts to prepare a mind-map to assist you to achieve the specific requirements of the topic that you have selected.

Follow either the writing structure of formal essay writing, or the structure of a formal Māori speech.



KAUPAPA TUATAHI: E te Minita Karauna
