

Honoa ngā wāhanga kōrero kia oti mai ai he rerenga kōrero Joining sentences

Teacher Instruction:

The learners are given a set of sentences that have been cut in half. They must work out which two halves go together to recreate each sentence.

If the sentences form a short paragraph of story, they can then organise/sequence the sentences into a logical, meaningful order.

Discuss how they worked out:

- 1. which halves go together were there any clues they looked for?
- 2. which order the sentences should go in.





Student Activity Card

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He Tohutohu ki ngā Ākonga:

Hui katoa, e 6 ngā rerenga kōrero. Heoi anō, kua tapahia ia rerenga kōrero kia 2 ngā wāhanga. Ko tāu, he hono i ngā wāhanga tika e 2 kia tika anō te takoto mai o aua rerenga kōrero e 6.

He tīwhiri, he kupu ārahi:

- Pānuitia ngā wāhanga korero katoa i te tīmatanga.
- Ko ngā tohutuhi pērā i te pūmatua, i te kopi, i te piko, i te tohupātai, i te tohukī, hei āwhina i a koe.
- Kimihia ētahi atu tīwhiri i roto tonu i ngā korero. Hei tauira, mehemea ko te kupu 'pātai' kei te wāhanga tuatahi o tētahi rerenga korero, kimihia he wāhanga korero tuarua he tohupātai kei roto hei whakaoti i taua rerenga.

Print on card, laminate and cut on the lines. Put instructions and cut up sentences in plastic sealable bag for students to use.

Example Text:

Use a table to write sentences to join. Cut along the lines.

Ka haere a Hoani rāua	ko Mere ki te toa.
Kei te hoko	kai rāua mō te hui.
Kua tuhia e rāua	te rārangi kai.
He pēkana, he inu ārani, he	rīwai, he hēki ngā kai.
Ka pātai a Hoani ki a	Mere, "E hia te utu o te pēkana?"
Ka whakautu a Mere,	"E waru tāra, e toru tekau hēneti."
